The Arizona Diaper Bank’s (AZDB) mission is to promote dignity through community partnerships by making diapers, period products, and incontinence supplies accessible to families in need. Founded in 1994, AZDB is the nation’s first dedicated diaper bank established in the United States, and a proud member of the Alliance for Period Supplies and National Diaper Bank Network. Through its walk-in distribution and network of community agencies, AZDB has distributed over 3 million diapers annually to low-income families statewide.

Providing diapers, incontinence supplies, and period products is more than just meeting a basic need. It’s about supporting health, dignity, and financial stability. When families have access to these essentials, they can put more of their limited resources toward things like rent, groceries, and medications. Babies are less likely to suffer from rashes or neglect, older adults and people with disabilities can feel more independent, and menstruators can manage their cycles with confidence all month long.
