Outreach Intern

Project Description:

Outreach interns are trained to be our ambassadors to either students or seniors. Student outreach interns perform analysis of various student populations to determine which groups would be most likely to show an interest in volunteering with us, and then reach out to those targets to tell them about who we are, and the value of their work for us. Senior outreach interns reach out to different senior communities to identify whom would be best to address whether the community's residents could benefit from our programs, and then speak with them to ensure that they're fully aware of our program and its benefits. We train interns for both of these roles. Outreach interns are responsible for tracking their work in our tracking spreadsheets. Interns should be good communicators and able to motivate themselves when working independently.

All work is remote.

Please note: these internships run 16 weeks with the agency. Students can only officially earn contact hours for HPS 493 during the official semester dates.

- In Fall and Spring semesters, UArizona student interns will need to "volunteer" for 1 additional week.
- In Summer semester, UArizona student interns will need to "volunteer" for 6 additional weeks.
