Internship Project Title

Fraternity & Sorority Programs Undergraduate Public Health Intern

Project Description:

The FSP Public Health Internship is a full academic year experience from Fall to Spring semester. The public health intern is expected to work 10 hours per week with the option of in-person and remote hours at the discretion of the direct supervisor. The public health intern will assist in the Hunter White Health Advocate Program, including the 10-week session and the three-credit class (*Health & Wellness in Greek Life*). The public health intern will act as a preceptor for the Health and Wellness in Greek Life 3-credit course to gain knowledge on the health of this specific population. They will help research and create lectures for the course, survey class participants, and create deliverables based on the data collected via survey. During the fall semester, the public health intern will survey student participants on alcohol usage in Greek Life and analyze the data to create an alcohol-awareness campaign. During the spring semester, interns will survey participants and create a Community Health Needs Assessment. The alcohol awareness campaign and the Community Health Needs Assessment will be the major deliverables to be submitted and presented to the direct supervisor at the end of the corresponding semester. Additionally, it is highly encouraged for the public health intern to attend all major health and wellness programming hosted by Fraternity & Sorority Programs including Safe Spring Break Symposium, Great Greek Weekend, Love Mom & Dad, and other cornerstone events as deemed necessary by the direct supervisor. This position may require some weekend hours.
