Located in Nogales, AZ, SEAHEC serves 3 border counties – Pima, Santa Cruz and Cochise. Established in 1985, our mission is “to recruit, train and retain culturally competent health professionals in southeast Arizona.

To achieve our mission SEAHEC implements three pillar programs in rural tribal and border communities:

Future Health Leaders, high school based health career clubs that motivate youth from rural tribal and border communities to learn about health professions. We provide mentors and role models, university tours and engaging health science related community projects, and individualized assistance in applying to college.

Health Professions Student Training opportunities – for students in public health, medicine, nursing, pharmacy and other health careers, SEAHEC connects students to clinical and community rotations, internships and volunteer opportunities, including service learning.

Continuing Education/Medical Education – SEAHEC provides life-long learning opportunities for health professionals in underserved communities, allowing them to keep skills updated and continue with their licensure.

Measuring Impact – Documenting & Assessing Health Professions Development in Rural, Tribal and Border Communities of Southeast Arizona

Project Description:

This paid internship will help us better tell the story of what we do and how our programs impact health professions students and their future practice. The intern will be responsible for inputting and helping analyze data for the 3 pillar programs described. Intern should have program evaluation skills as well as experiences in SPSS and or EXCEL and an interest in serving rural, tribal and border communities.

Expected outcomes include: Development of a dashboard of indicators in a format presentable to our Governing Board of Directors.

Intern will report to the Executive Director and work closely with the 3 Program Coordinators. While work schedule is flexible, intern needs to be in Nogales, on a bi-weekly basis (mileage reimbursement included). Anticipated hours per month 32 (8/wk) \$400 stipend per month contingent upon completion of data entry and analysis. Duration of internship 3 – 6 month. Start date: ASAP.
