Torch Club/Rookie Rockstars

Project Description:

Torch Club and Rookie Rockstars are two key leadership programs at our Clubhouse that give youth the opportunity to be engaged in running their clubhouse and learning leadership skills. Torch Club engages youth ages 10 to 12 and Rookie Rockstars engages ages 7-9. Both clubs help members learn to elect officers and work together to implement activities in four areas: service to Club and community; education; health and fitness; and social recreation. The National Torch Club Awards are presented annually to Torch Clubs with outstanding programs and activities in each area. This project would oversee the implementation of both programs and ensure that youth are engaged in a variety of leadership activities and opportunities, including weekly meetings and service projects.
