Organization Background:

Arizona Serve has partnered with the Southern Arizona Anti-Trafficking Unified Network (SAATURN) to place two 300-hour AmeriCorps members to support curriculum development. SAATURN is a newly-created project of the UA Southwest Institute for Research on Women in collaboration with the CODAC Health, Recovery, and Wellness and the Tucson Police Department that aims to increase law enforcement activities and victim services for human trafficking cases. This position will support the creation of curriculum pertaining to forming healthy relationships, using social media responsibly and other issues pertaining to human trafficking.

Southern Arizona Anti-Trafficking Unified Response Network Curriculum Development on Healthy Relationships.

Project Description:

These AmeriCorps members will work in a team at SAATURN to develop curriculum for youth and adults on responsible social media use, healthy relationships, and other preventative topics pertaining to human trafficking. Members will then provide the curriculum at local Tucson area schools that participate in the Tucson Community Schools Initiative. Members will be also expected to collect data for an evaluation of the curriculum.
